I attended the CBA Real Estate Section Council ("RESC") meeting on 10/16/21. Members participated in person, as well as by Zoom. The following is my report on matters addressed which the CBA Trust and Estate Section Council ("TESC") might find of interest:

*I reported to the RESC that the Trust and Estate Section has formed a subcommittee to address the issues related to property insurance coverage and beneficiary deeds in light of the recent Strope-Robinson decision. James Benjamin and Charles Calvin are two real estate attorneys who have an interest in this matter and might want to get involved.

*The 2022 Real Estate Section Symposium will be in Vail in July. There will be an option to attend live or virtually.

*Title Standard 8.4 on fractional mineral interests was brought before the RESC and approved. Now it goes before the CBA Executive Council. This standard tries to bring some clarity to a muddled area of the law concerning multiple conveyances of fractions of fractional mineral interest reservations.

*The Colorado Diverse Attorney Community Circle Program is seeking applicants currently for the 2022 Class. Its objective is to provide diverse attorneys with 4 sets of programming to promote more involvement in a variety of leadership positions: regular networking and affinity events and retreats; public service opportunities; bimonthly REDI CLEs; and mentoring relationships.
