

## COLORADO MINORITY LAW SCHOLARSHIP CONSORTIUM

The Colorado Minority Law Scholarship Consortium was formed as a nonprofit corporation in December, 1988. Its members are the Colorado Hispanic Bar Association, the Sam Cary Bar Association, the Colorado Indian Bar Association, the University of Colorado School of Law, the University of Denver College of Law, and the Colorado Bar Association (through the Minority Admissions Subcommittee of the CBA's Legal Education and Admissions Committee).

The Consortium's purpose is to raise money from Colorado foundations, businesses, law firms, and individuals to assist residents of Colorado who are members of minority groups to enter the Colorado Bar. Funds raised will be used to provide stipends to bar applicants so that they will not need to work while preparing for the bar exam.

The Consortium's Presidency and Vice Presidency rotates among the Presidents and Vice Presidents of the three minority bar associations which are members. Currently Dan Vigil is President of the Consortium, Melody McCoy is Vice President (and President-elect), and Mary Phillips is Secretary/Treasurer. The Trustees, each representing a Consortium member, are Dan Vigil, Melodie McCoy, Gary Jackson, Gene Nichol, Rufina Hernandez, and Mary Phillips.
