- B. Review and Approve Minutes from January 21, 2016 Meeting
 - Motion was seconded and passed unanimously
- C. Presentation by Justin Bertron on the subject of gun trusts. Justin received his LL.M. in Taxation with a Certificate in Estate Planning from Georgetown University. He currently practices estate planning and wealth preservation as an associate attorney at Davis Schilken, P.C.
 - *See* Handout, "Gun Trusts: how to own, share, and transfer firearms responsibly"
 - Licensed firearm dealer in CO can't sell out of state
 - NFA
 - non transferrable and license must be specific to firearm and the individual who owns it
 - violation results in prison and fines (up to 10 years and \$250k)
 - o some states prohibit these, Colorado permits them
 - Ownership--own as individual or entity

- Gun Trust
 - Special purpose revocable living trust designed to own firearms and accessories
 - More flexible than the other alternatives for personal use
 - o Helps reduce risk of both "accidental felony" and probate
 - Benefits of a gun trust informing people how to make transfers and how to transfer legally
 - Incapacity
 - Death
 - Accidental felony
 - Co-owners and authorized users appoint special trustee (permission slip) for limited time/purpose
 - No fingerprints or photographs are required for a trust(ee) will change 7/13/16
 - No CLEO signature required will change 7/13/16
 - Privacy
 - Firearms and accessories grandfathered in under the Trust (trust dynasty)
- ATF Rule 41F
 - o Effective 7/13/16
 - Targeted at entities, not individuals
 - Does not affect conventional firearms, only NFA items
 - o Universal background checks
 - "Responsible person" has to submit photograph, fingerprints and subject to background check
 - Loophole No requirement to update ATF when a responsible person is added to trust
 - Remove trustees from trust, submit paperwork to ATF, then once approved, add trustees back
 - Chief Law Enforcement Office Notice
 - Notice requirement to sheriff in county you live in includes all names of trustees and successor trustees; and provide change of address form if/when move
 - Average gun trust has 7-8 individuals named so this will result in increased workload to ATF
 - New "Accidental Felony" failure to document an RP will expose owners to an unlawful transfer
- Rev Trust
 - Include gun ownership on questionnaire
 - Include language that this is not intended to create a gun trust
 - Give trustee discretion
 - If beneficiary is prohibited person, give to someone else who is not prohibited or sell it and give the beneficiary the money;

0	Beneficiary cannot be prohibited person - get beneficiary to sign
