Anthony van Westrum

Born in Indianapolis, Indiana, Mr. van Westrum earned a B.S. degree in Mechanical Engineering from Purdue University in 1966. He graduated *cum laude* from the University of Michigan Law School in 1969. Directly out of law school, he became employed as an associate at Davis, Graham & Stubbs, LLP. He was employed at the Denver firm for twenty-one years, achieving partner status. He retired from the firm in 1990. In 1991, he began working with Burns, Wall, Smith and Mueller, P.C., where he served as a Shareholder, as well as Special Counsel, which capacity he maintains today. In 1994, he formed his own firm, Anthony van Westrum, LLC. For the past sixteen years, his firm has focused on complex corporate and business law issues and arbitration/mediation.

Mr. van Westrum's involvement with the CBA is extensive, including: serving on the Board of Governors since 1999; Dispute Resolution Section Council since 2005 (serving as secretary in 2007–08 and vice-chair in 2008–09); *Amicus Curiae* Brief Committee since 1996 (serving as chair 2001–08); Ethics Committee since 1998; Business Law Section Council since 1991 (serving as chair 1995–97); and numerous subsections of the Business Law Section. He has been an invaluable member of the Legislative Policy Committee since 1992, where he has drafted and modified legislation. On numerous occasions, he has testified before the Colorado Legislature on business law-related issues. He served on the CBA's Multidisciplinary Practice Task Force and Professional Reform Initiative Task Force, as well as on the Colorado Governor's Task Force on Civil Justice Reform.

As a member of the American Bar Association, Mr. van Westrum has participated in the Business Law Section and on a number of the association's special committees. He currently serves on the Colorado Supreme Court Standing Committee on the Colorado Rules of Professional Conduct, Colorado Office of Dispute Resolution Advisory Committee, Colorado Secretary of State's Business Division Advisory Committee, Colorado Office of Legislative Legal Services–Colorado Revised Statutes Advisory Committee, and Colorado Association of Corporate Counsel (president in 1994–95). He also is a member of the American Law Institute and National Panel of Commercial Arbitrators of the American Arbitration Association.

In 2001, Mr. van Westrum was presented the CBA Susan E. Burch Legislative Achievement Award. In 2006, he received the Denver Bar Association's Award of Merit.

2010 GRANTS — \$84,200

Descriptions taken from their grant applications

Arvada Teen Court — \$1,000

The funds will be used for the operation and continued development of the Arvada Teen Court and its program and alternative sentencing options.

Center for Education in Law and Democracy — \$3,000

Funds will be used for a civics professional development program which will provide 125 Colorado teachers with the most current law-related content, strategies and connections to lawyers, judges, and policy makers.

CBA Civic & Community Affairs Committee, Elder Law Section and Trust & Estate Section — \$5,000

To help fund the printing of the 2011 Senior Law Handbook that is distributed to 4,000 seniors and others statewide.

CBA High School Mock Committee — \$5,000

The funds will be used to assist in defraying the travel expenses incurred by the Colorado State Mock Trial Championship team while attending and representing Colorado at the 2011 National High School Mock Trial Championship. The grant will also be distributed evenly to all local bars that will be hosting a regional high school mock trial tournament in their area.

Colorado Center on Law and Policy — \$5,000

The grant will support CCLP's ongoing litigation efforts and monitoring of the settlement agreement for the Colorado Benefits Management System (CBMS) case, as well as advocacy efforts before State Administrative Agencies.

Colorado Close Up — \$3,500

Funds will be used to provide scholarships to allow low-income high school students from across Colorado to attend Colorado Close Up, a civic-education and leadership development program.

Colorado CASA — \$2,500

The funds will provide underwriting for the 15th Annual Colorado CASA Training Conference on October 23, 2010 in Denver.

Colorado Cross-Disability Coalition — \$2,000

The funds will be used to help pay for the individual advocacy program that provides certified volunteer advocates to assist people to obtain or maintain public benefits.

Colorado Judicial Institute — \$5,000

Funds will be used in support of programs designed to educate the public about the judicial performance evaluation program, expand the appropriate use of alternative dispute resolution within the courts, preserve judicial independence, educate the public about the role of an independent judiciary, improve the delivery of justice to families and children in the courts, recognize judicial excellence, and raise funds for judicial education.

Colorado Lawyers for the Arts — \$1,000

Funds will be used to develop a knowledge management database, “Leonardo,” that will be the premier online library for volunteer arts lawyers in Colorado.

Colorado Lawyers Helping Lawyers — \$5,000

Funds will be used for general operating support for a Colorado Supreme Court-approved, volunteer-based, independent non-profit lawyers’ assistance program.

Colorado Legal Services — \$4,500

Funds will be used to develop several A2J/HotDocs online court form preparation interviews to serve *pro se* individuals who are filing cases in Colorado courts. The project will fund the staff salary necessary to develop the forms, and also fund outreach efforts to promote the use of the project.

Colorado Springs Teen Court, Inc. — \$1,000

Funds will be used to allow Teen Court to continue to help over 620 youth offenders by providing restorative justice alternatives to regular Municipal Court sentencing for first-time misdemeanor offenders between the ages of 10 and 18.

Court Care for the Pikes Peak Region, Inc. — \$2,000

The funds will be used to provide child care in a safe, family-friendly environment for children of individuals who have court-related business, keeping children out of District courtrooms.

Crossroads Safehouse, Inc. — \$1,000

The Bringing Justice Home Project (BJH) of Crossroads Safehouse provides free, bilingual legal representation to indigent victims of domestic violence, stalking, and sexual assault in six Colorado counties.

Denver Center for Crime Victims — \$1,000

The funds will be used to provide legal representation to immigrant victims of domestic violence and sexual assault who are self-petitioning for legal permanent residency under the provisions of the Violence Against Women Act.

Faculty of Federal Advocates — \$2,000

Funds will be used to assist FFA in supporting already established programs and services, including the *Pro Bono* Counsel/Co-Counsel program, the Bankruptcy *Pro Bono* Legal Service, and CLE's related to these *pro bono* programs. The funds will specifically be used to pay costs and expenses related to the *pro bono* litigation, as well as expert witness fees and costs, training for attorneys accepting *pro bono* cases and research materials to assist attorneys in litigating the *pro bono* cases.

First Judicial District Bar Association Legal Assistance Program — \$1,200

The funds will be used to provide free and low-cost legal information, services and advice to seniors, 55-years and older, residing in the First Judicial District; to educate seniors on current elder law matters that may affect their lives; and to promote the LAP in the community.

The Legal Center for People with Disabilities and Older People — \$3,000

The funds will be used for the HIV Legal Rights Network (formerly called HIV Legal Project), which provides legal and advocacy assistance to people living with HIV/AIDS in Colorado to help them receive entitlements provided by law that help them live free from discrimination, abuse and neglect.

Our Courts — \$4,000

Funds will be used to assist in defraying expenses incurred by the Our Courts information programs.

Project Safeguard — \$4,000

Funds will be used to develop a network for the five locations where legal advocacy services are provided. This system would include a case management component to document services and minimize duplication of services or referrals when clients seek assistance from multiple locations.

Recording for the Blind & Dyslexic, Rocky Mountain Unit (RFB&D) — \$1,000

Funds from this grant will be used to help RFB&D reach more students in Colorado by providing operating support.

Rocky Mountain Children's Law Center — \$5,000

Funding will be used to recruit and train *pro bono* attorneys to advocate for child victims of domestic violence and represent foster parents to advocate for the rights of children in their care.

Safe Shelter of St. Vrain Valley — \$1,500

Funds will be used to support our legal program, which provides legal assistance and attorney services to domestic violence victims who require assistance and or representation.

San Luis Valley Bar Association Pro Bono Project, Inc. - \$5,000

The funds will be used for the purpose of continuing the Project's efforts to provide legal consultation and assistance without charge to all individuals, without discrimination, who cannot otherwise afford to hire an attorney.

University of Colorado Law School — \$3,000

The funds will be used to finance two loan repayment assistance program (LRAP) awards to be granted to students who take low-paying interest jobs after law school in order to assist them in paying back student debt. NOTE: The Board voted to grant funds, not for LRAP, but for a program chosen by the school that benefits a greater number of students.

University of Denver Sturm College of Law — \$3,000

The Public Interest Clerkship program provides opportunities for students to engage in unpaid legal work during the summer break on behalf of non-profit organizations. The money would go to the student clerkship recipients, not the organization. NOTE: The Board voted to grant funds, not for the Clerkship, but for a program chosen by the school that benefits a greater number of students.

Weld County Legal Services — \$4,000

The funds will be used to join Colorado Lawyer's Committee "Legal Night" offered in Weld County and to offer educational seminars.
