### Hotel

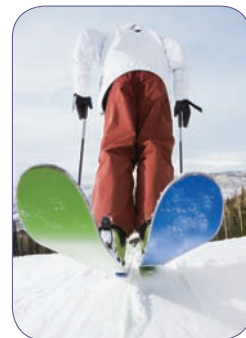
