Dr. Jesús Treviño

Dr. Jesús Treviño is the Associate Provost for Multicultural Excellence and Director of the Center for Multicultural Excellence, at the University of Denver. Previously, Dr. Treviño was Director of the Intergroup Relations Center, Office of the Senior Vice-President and Provost, at Arizona State University. He earned his B.A. in 1979 and his M. A. in 1982, both from Eastern Michigan University. In 1992, Dr. Treviño graduated from UCLA with both an M. A. and Ph.D. in Education with an emphasis on higher education. Between 1985 and 1988, he worked at Southern Methodist University as the Coordinator of Hispanic Student Services. In 1992, Dr. Treviño became Assistant Dean for Cultural Diversity in the Office of Student Life, at Arizona State University. His areas of expertise include: inclusive excellence, campus climate issues, campus intergroup relations, diversity training, and the collegiate experiences of students of color.
