\* Bruce M. Kramer is the Maddox Professor of Law Emeritus at Texas Tech University School of Law and of counsel at McGinnis, Lochridge & Kilgore of Houston, Texas. From 1974 through 2006 Professor Kramer taught at Texas Tech University School of Law. He was also a visitor at Indiana University (Bloomington), Lewis & Clark Law School, University of Florida Holland Law Center and the University of Texas School of Law. He is the co-author of The Law of Pooling and Unitization (3d ed.), Williams and Meyers Oil and Gas Law

(since 1996) and Cases and Materials on Oil and Gas Law (8<sup>th</sup> ed.). He is the author of over 50 law review articles including "The Sisyphean Task of Interpreting Mineral Deeds and Leases: An Encyclopedia of Canons of Construction" and "The Mangling of Property Law." He is a frequent speaker at continuing legal education programs sponsored by such entities as the Rocky Mountain Mineral Law Foundation, Center for American and International Law, Institute for Energy Law, Energy and Mineral Law Foundation, Colorado Bar Association, State Bar of Texas, University of Texas School of Law, University of New Mexico School of Law and Texas Tech University School of Law. He is a member of the Board of Trustees of the Rocky Mountain Mineral Law Foundation, a trustee of the Energy and Mineral Law Foundation and on the executive committee of the Institute for Energy Law. He is also the administrative editor of the Oil and Gas Reporter.
