Jeremy Schupbach (Legislative Update)

- Appreciates this sections communication on bills in spite of our failure often to come to an agreement on particular bills.
- Colorado Dept. of Human Services Bill that amends CRS 19-2-310 Not introduced yet –
 Department of Human Services and Department of Youth Corrections bill to eliminate holds for
 juveniles who are accused of certain crimes: May not hold 10 to 12 year olds unless accused of
 felonies or weapons offenses. Discussion is held regarding both the merits of the bill and
 whether we should have a vote.
 - Mueller moves to table the issue until the bill is introduced then proceed by e-mail vote;
 Seconded by Frolich. Elizabeth will e-mail out, the chair would establish a deadline and the Secretary would report out the results.
 - Additional discussion on procedure; Judge Bernard reminds the group that we have agreed that we should report out thoughts on bills and even if we can't reach a consensus.
- House Bill 1015 Clarify Good Time Sentence Reductions In Jails This bill consolidates and clarifies various statutory sections concerning reductions of sentences for county jail inmates. Jeremy suggests that the section do take a position on this bill. Will forward to Elizabeth.
- House Bill 1017 Passing Refund Money After Conviction The section may be able to agree on this bill. To be flagged for review
- House Bill 1101 Determining the Place of trial in Sex Assault Cases Maureen raises concerns
 that the Defense Bar may have that the bill is unconstitutional Unlikely we will reach
 consensus.
- Senate Bill 51 Clean-up of Victim Rights Unlikely we will reach consensus as to a couple
 issues one of which is sequestration but these issues may be worked out. To be flagged for
 review.
- Senate Bill 87 Determinate sentences for sex offenses.
- Senate Bill 94 Repeal of the death penalty. Jeremy suggests that the Crim. Section report out the thoughts of the members even if we can't come to a consensus. The civil rights section is supporting the bill.
- Senate Bill 115 Expand Law Enforcement Exception for Sexually Exploitive Materials Provides
 protections for defense lawyers who receive sexually exploitive material (by accident
 occasionally). The council agrees that while we could reach consensus, there is no need to
 address it as a group because it will pass regardless of what we do.
