4. Chair's Report Amy Brimal
a. Update on SymposiumJim Meseck and Susie McNulty
Ms. Susie McNulty provided an update on Symposium registration: 57 are registered, 29 of those are faculty. 3 of those are planning to attend virtually.
There will be a book club discussion about the book Nomadland by Bob Wells. It will be brownbag. Deanne Stodden will be on stage with Bob Wells to facilitate the discussion.
b. Section Council and Leadership (update)Angie Schmitz
Ms. Angie Schmitz updated the group that she, Ms. Lindsey O'Connell, and Ms. Joan Fritsche met to choose the nominees for council.

5. Action Items:

a. Amendment to bylaws for affordable housing subcommittee.....Amy Brimah and Melinda Pasquini

Ms. Melinda Pasquini described the amendments to the bylaws to create the new subcommittee. The Chair of the section will appoint the chair and members of the subcommittee. Melinda suggested involving Alex Gano, who had suggested the new subcommittee.

Ms. Stodden moved to approve the bylaw changes, Michelle DeVoe seconded, the motion passed unanimously.

b. Votes on Reviewed Bills......Amy Brimah

SB23-213	Zoning	Monitor	Amy Brimah and Erin Clark	

Ms. Brimah opened discussion of SB23-213, a zoning bill which includes state-level power to require municipalities to provide for middle housing and ADUs in single-family zoning areas.

Mr. Ron Jung moved to have the section oppose the bill. Ms. O'Connell seconded. 7 members voted for the motion; 7 voted to oppose the motion; 1 voted to abstain.

Discussion followed. Mr. Meseck objects to state-level involvement in zoning, as it is an area of local power. He believes this is the most significant issue he has seen in his time on the council. Mr. Jung also objects to state involving in zoning and believes there are takings issues.

Ms. Brimah sees the bill as addressing lack of affordability and historic inequities in housing. She noted that this is a controversial policy issue, which is outside the purview of bar. Ms. Schmitz stated that she believes half of our membership will be unhappy with the section if we take a position one way or another.

Mr. Kessler stated that he believes this sort of change requires a constitutional amendment.

Mr. Meseck stated that he would be interested in what our members feel about this issue.

Mr. Geoff Anderson stated that zoning is a give and take, but this bill interrupts established expectation.

Mr. Aldrich stated that the legislature is not an effective place to take positions on this, perhaps amicus briefs when parts are challenged in court.

Geoff: zoning is give and take. This interrupts established expectations

Ms. Brimah moved to have the section monitor the bill. Michelle DeVoe seconded.

8 voted in favor of the motion (Marjorie Sant, Deanne Stodden, Michelle DeVoe, Angela Schmitz, Amy Brimah, Adam Aldrich, Katy Dunn, John Koechel)

7 voted to oppose the motion (Jim Meseck, Ron Jung, Lindsey O'Connell, Reagan Larkin, Joan Fritsche, Zak Kessler, Eric Snyder).

c. Budget.....Jim Meseck

Mr. Meseck reviewed issues to consider in the budget.

Topical lunches are an income producer, so it is worth considering increasing price, maintaining frequency.

We spent \$12,000 in grants this year, which is more than usual.

The proposed budget is revenue neutral. We have a ~\$50k reserve.

The dues increased this year, from \$30 to \$35. \$35 is similar to other sections this size.

Ms. Brimah stated that she is not in favor of further increasing dues at this time.

Mr. Meseck noted that this year we raised dues and did not have any loss of membership; instead had more registrations.

We expect costs to go up for everything.

Ms. Jess Ham noted that surpluses for other sections are more like \$20k

Ms. Pasquini noted that this is the first balanced budget in a few years because there was a large surplus and we purposely spent it down.

Mr. Jung moved to approve the budget. Ms. Brimah seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Kessler stated his concern that the lunch CLEs impact attendance at full day CLEs.

Zak response to his question by Amy: budget assumes 10k for topical lunches. That's the price for section members. Possible could partner with other sections.

Ms. Pasquini stated that topical lunches are good for engagement of members, and allows for timely discussion of new witnesses.

Ms. Brimah stated that the groupcan discuss a possible increase in topical lunch price at the May meeting. There could be tiered pricing for section members, CBA members, non CBA members.

Mr. Mounsey provided an update on the status of bills we have taken positions on. He noted that time is an issue—17 days-- and bills will likely die because they won't pass in time.

1095 regarding prohibited items in leases has passed.

148 regarding illegal drug labs-working on amendments

1171 regarding just cause eviction. Has been heavily amended, in the Senate, waiting for further action

- 1137 the CCIOA bill has not moved forward
- 213 has received more criticism than the governor may have expected

Adam Aldrich has prepared a spreadsheet with the status of the bills
