

## High School Mock Trial Artist Contest

### Rules/Requirements:

- All participants must register to participate. This is a separate registration than team sign up.
- All participants must complete a permission slip authorizing the publication or reprinting of their Artist Contest submission for educational purposes. No financial compensation will be awarded.
- Student participants are not required to have a team associated with their school competing.
- All contestants must sketch their artwork based on their assigned team's Round 2 trial.
- Round 2:
  - o Introduce yourself to the scorers, say your name and identify yourself as the courtroom artist.
  - o You may sit in the jury box away from scorers if available. You must wear your nametag.
  - o Once you are seated, you may not have any contact with anyone in the courtroom. (parents, teachers, or fellow students). You must sketch your artwork completely independently.
- After the conclusion of Round 2, all contestants must submit their artwork to the courtroom monitor.
- Submitted artwork should depict an actual courtroom scene observed during the trial. Art submissions may be done in color or in black and white.
- The art submission must have the artist's name and team code placed on the back of the sketch; no signatures on the front of the submission are allowed.
- Contestants may refer to the Colorado Mock Trial case materials and the judging criteria during the contest.

Awards for the Artist Contest will be presented at the Award Ceremony at the State Tournament.
