- Please include any documentation of research in a works cited page; essays believed to be written with AI will be disqualified.
- Winners will be announced on Law Day, May 1, 2026.
- Winning essays will be published in the *Colorado Lawyer*, and all winners will receive a complimentary copy of the publication.

WRITING PROMPTS

Middle School, 6th-8th Grade

The American Dream is built on the idea that everyone should have an equal opportunity to pursue their goals. What are your dreams for the future? What do you hope to do or become? Write about your dreams and describe how laws and rights—like equality, education, or freedom—help you and others have the chance to make those dreams come true. (Suggested word count: 800 to 1,000 words.)

High School, 8th-12th Grade

Reflect on your own goals for the future—what you hope to achieve—and discuss how the rule of law supports your ability to pursue those goals. Consider what challenges might arise if these protections did not exist. (Suggested word count: 1,000 to 1,200 words.)
