i. Mr. Meseck welcomed the new appointments. Those in attendance introduced themselves.

### 5. Action Items:

a. <u>Miller v. Amos</u> Amicus Brief Draft ...... Jim Meseck, Deanne Stodden

Ms. Deanne Stodden summarized the current draft of the brief. The Landlord/Tenant Task Force asked for feedback regarding whether the brief should still contain the policy arguments that they are recommending. Ms. Stodden stated that the statute creates problems between which court should hear these cases where the CFHA defense is raised (County vs. District Court). Ms. Stodden noted that most fair housing investigations take 400 or more days, which does not fit the statutory scheme created for the streamlined forcible entry and detainer process. Mr. Damien Cox and Mr. Kessler, among others, think that the policy arguments need to be included in the brief. Ms. Stodden agreed to work with the Landlord/Tenant Task Force to complete the brief for Executive Council review by September 29<sup>th</sup> to meet the filing deadline imposed by the Supreme Court.

### 6. Legislative Matters.....Jim Meseck

- a. Mr. Adam Aldrich noted that Tyler Mounsey and a legislator are working on a legislative fix to the issues created by the Fairways at Buffalo Run case, but it is unclear if the legislator will sponsor the bill in the 2024 session.

Mr. Meseck stated that all of these cases and issues highlight some of the problematic short-term rental regulations/taxes cropping up throughout Colorado (and elsewhere). Mr. Meseck pointed these out so that the Council Members are aware that these issues exist and could be sources for legislation in the 2024 legislative session. Ms. Carolin Topelson noted that NYC litigation has commenced over rules/laws there that are even more stringent on short-term rental offerings, which may have a chilling effect in other markets.

### **REPORTS AND INFORMATIONAL ITEMS**

### 8. Interprofessional Committee

a. Ms. Larkin stated that the Colorado Mortgage Lenders Association is trying to get an affordable/attainable housing forum together with stakeholders from various groups in an effort to get more affordable housing built more quickly with the assistance of local governments.

### 9. Education/CLE Committee <u>Joan Fritsche</u>, Miro Kovacevic, Carolin Topelson

a. Ms. Joan Fritsche said the Fall Update is scheduled for October 12<sup>th</sup>, and she noted that there are 28 in-person registrants with 23 registered for the remote offering. Topics include the Corporate Transparency Act, a Property 101 Refresher, and a session on best practices and pitfalls associated with translating real estate documents for non-native English-speaking clients. Mr. Steve Nagy thinks that CBA-CLE might have concerns about the lack of in-person registrations, and he thinks as an organizer of these in the past that they represent hours of work for so few attendees. Mr. Nagy offered to ask Ms. Susan McNulty about the difference between this registration and pre-covid numbers, if any.

### 10. Education/Topical Lunches Committee <u>Deanne Stodden</u>, John Koechel, Jordan Bunch

a. Ms. Stodden noted that last week's Topical Lunch on the Great Northern case was attended by 52 people online. The Committee is still looking for a presenter for an October lunch. Ms. Stodden stated that they have a lunch CLE on current issues in water law planned for November, and the Committee is still working on one for December.

### 11. Communications Committee <u>Joan Fritsche</u>, Josh McMahon, Michelle DeVoe

a. Ms. Fritsche explained that the Fall Newsletter is almost complete. The Committee was waiting for the final information on upcoming topical lunches. Ms. Fritsche explained that this year the newsletter in the Fall will feature a new section on the Willis Carpenter Award recipient from the Symposium instead of an article. The Committee will add the updated date for the volunteer event with Habitat for Humanity to the Newsletter before sending it out.

### 12. Publications Committee <u>Steve Nagy</u>, Reagan Larkin, Josh McMahon, Eric Snyder

a. Mr. Nagy explained the publications plan now for the year, which will include an article soon regarding the tax lien sale process with Constitutional analysis. The Committee is also reviewing a Landlord/Tenant eviction article that needs to be revised because of all the new legislation in the area.

a. Mr. John Koechel explained that the Habitat for Humanity build event was to be in Evergreen on 9/25, but Habitat has asked to reschedule it until October. They have yet

to confirm a date. The Committee is looking for more people to volunteer because the event needs at least 20 people. So far there are only between 5-10 people registered.

Mr. Tueller is looking at another event outside of Denver, which would be similar to the Real Estate and Art event held in Telluride a few years ago. Mr. Tueller could see the event focusing on affordable housing and short-term rentals. Mr. Tueller suggested that future Newsletters highlight non-Denver issues like the recent Vail Valley condemnation case between the Town and Vail Resorts or Telluride losing a case with the Colorado Supreme Court over questionable "spot" zoning.
