Uniform Directed Trust Act**

Section Title	Short Title
Statutory Language	This [act] may be cited as the Directed Trust Act.
Uniform Law Commission Comment	This act governs a set of trust arrangements that are commonly known as “directed trusts.” In rough terms, a directed trust is a trust in which a person other than a trustee holds a fiduciary power to direct some aspect of the trust’s administration. Under this act, the person who holds such a power is called a “trust director,” and a trustee that is subject to such a power is called a “directed trustee” (see Section 2(2) and (6)). This act covers any arrangement that exhibits the functional features of a directed trust, even if the terms of the trust use other terminology, such as a “trust protector” or a “trust advisor.”
Current Colorado Law	The current Colorado Directed Trustees Act is at C.R.S. § 15-16-801 et seq., but there is no section assigning a formal title to the act.
