(a) NOTICE TO A PERSON UNDER THIS ARTICLE OR THE SENDING OF A DOCUMENT TO A PERSON UNDER THIS ARTICLE MUST BE ACCOMPLISHED IN A MANNER REASONABLY SUITABLE UNDER THE CIRCUMSTANCES AND LIKELY TO RESULT IN RECEIPT OF THE NOTICE OR DOCUMENT. PERMISSIBLE METHODS OF NOTICE OR FOR SENDING A DOCUMENT INCLUDE FIRST-CLASS MAIL, PERSONAL DELIVERY, DELIVERY TO THE PERSON'S LAST-KNOWN PLACE OF RESIDENCE OR PLACE OF BUSINESS, OR A PROPERLY DIRECTED ELECTRONIC MESSAGE.
- (b) Reserved. Notice otherwise required under this code or a document otherwise required to be sent under this code need not be provided to a person whose identity or location is unknown to and not reasonably ascertainable by the trustee. The trustee shall keep a record of documentation of the trustee's reasonable efforts to determine the location and/or identity of a beneficiary whose identity or whereabouts are unknown.
- (c) Notice under this code or the sending of a document under this code may be waived by the person to be notified or sent the document.
- (d) NOTICE OF A JUDICIAL PROCEEDING MUST BE GIVEN AS PROVIDED IN THE APPLICABLE RULES OF CIVIL PROCEDURE. COLORADO RULES OF PROBATE PROCEDURE, THE COLORADO PROBATE CODE, AND IF APPLICABLE, THE COLORADO RULES OF CIVIL PROCEDURE.

PERMISSIBLE METHODS OF NOTICE OR FOR SENDING A DOCUMENT INCLUDE FIRST-CLASS MAIL, PERSONAL DELIVERY, DELIVERY TO THE PERSON'S LAST-KNOWN PLACE OF RESIDENCE OR PLACE OF BUSINESS, OR A PROPERLY DIRECTED ELECTRONIC MESSAGE.
- (b) Reserved. A TRUSTEE NEED NOT PROVIDE A NOTICE OR DOCUMENT OTHERWISE REQUIRED UNDER THIS CODE OR A DOCUMENT OTHERWISE REQUIRED TO BE SENT UNDER THIS CODE NEED NOT BE PROVIDED TO A PERSON WHOSE IDENTITY OR LOCATION IS UNKNOWN TO AND NOT REASONABLY ASCERTAINABLE BY THE TRUSTEE. THE TRUSTEE SHALL KEEP A RECORD OF MAINTAIN DOCUMENTATION OF THE TRUSTEE'S REASONABLE EFFORTS TO DETERMINE ASCERTAIN THE LOCATION IDENTITY AND/OR IDENTITY LOCATION OF A BENEFICIARY WHOSE IDENTITY OR WHEREABOUTS ARE UNKNOWNSUCH A PERSON.
- (c) Notice under this code or the sending of a document under this code may be waived by the person to be notified or sent the document.
- (d) NOTICE OF A JUDICIAL PROCEEDING MUST BE GIVEN AS PROVIDED IN THE APPLICABLE RULES OF CIVIL PROCEDURE. COLORADO RULES OF PROBATE PROCEDURE, THE COLORADO PROBATE CODE, AND IF APPLICABLE, THE COLORADO RULES OF CIVIL PROCEDURE.

Apart from the language tidying in (b), my concern is that these provisions are intended to cover all of the notices that need to be provided by <u>any</u> party . . . But I understood that our effort in (b) is designed to relieve only a <u>trustee</u> from the burden of tracking down missing/unknown persons. (. . . Otherwise we shouldn't be basing this exception on the knowledge/efforts of just the trustee.)
