 - A. Elder law. UGCOPAA is a complete overhaul of Article 14 of Title 15. The reference to "incapacitated person" is found through Title 15, and UGCOPAA has eliminated this definition, so while the Elder Law section is spearheading the efforts, the Trust & Estate Section is creating a subcommittee to examine conforming amendments necessary if the Act is adopted in Colorado. There will no longer be a finding of incapacity but rather the trier of fact must determine specific circumstances in which the protected person is determined to be incapacitated. Judicial, State Court Administrator's Office, the Office of Public

Guardianship are joining the subcommittee. ARC of Colorado is talking to other stakeholders. Letitia Maxfield and Leia Ursery are heading this subcommittee.

C.R.S. § 15-5-103(10) "Interested person" means a qualified beneficiary or other person having a property right in or claim against a trust estate, which right or claim may reasonably and materially be affected by a judicial proceeding pursuant to this code. The term also includes fiduciaries and other persons having authority to act under the terms of the trust. The meaning as it relates to particular persons may vary from time to time and is determined according to the particular purposes of, and matter involved in, any proceeding.
